Dogs are resident in UK but imported from overseas (primarily Eastern Europe)</p> <p>2023/2024 – further cases have been recorded (heightened PVS awareness)</p> <p>2026: Emerging import concern in UK veterinary surveillance</p> <p>UK cannot be considered free from disease</p>

14.	Canine Babesiosis ( <i>Babesia gibsoni</i> ) in indigenous dogs	Confirmed cases in Essex 2016, 2017

18.	Crimean Congo Haemorrhagic Fever (CCHF)	<p>Human case confirmed in a traveller from Afghanistan and subsequently died from the disease, Oct 2012 (Euro Surveill. 2012 7(48):20327)</p> <p>Second human case reported in a traveller from Bulgaria July 2014, developed moderate symptoms but survived (Euro Surveill. 2014 19(30):20864)</p>
19.	Cysticercosis ( <i>Cysticercus cellulosae</i> )	Not recorded since 1992.
20.	Duck Viral Enteritis	<p>Never recorded (commercial poultry flocks)</p> <p>Sporadic cases in wild birds (game)</p>

21.	East Coast fever - Bovine Theileriosis ( <i>Theileria parva</i> )	Never recorded

23.	Equine paratyphoid ( <i>Salmonella abortus equi</i> )	Last reported in UK in 1989
24.	Equine piroplasmiasis	A small percentage of positive imported or travelled horses are resident in UK however Autochthonous equine (locally acquired) piroplasmiasis has never been recorded in GB
25	European Brown Hare Syndrome	Prevalent in the UK wild hare population. Never recorded within wild European rabbit population or any farmed rabbits

27.	Goose parvovirus	2008 - Irvine et al 2008 Vet Rec 164, 461
28.	Haemorrhagic septicaemia	Never recorded

Hantavirus infection	Cases confirmed pre-2014, more recent include: 2014 - Gloucester and Doncaster human cases of SEOV HFRS 2014 - 32.9% SEOV seroprevalence in UK pet rat owners (PHE <a href="#">report</a> ) 2015 - Wales three linked cases of SEOV HFRS (Outbreak) - pet and feeder rats (unpublished)  2019 cases in wild rats  2019 - Seoul virus associated with Pet rats, Scotland (EID 2021;27(10):2677-2680)  2026: Human cases from rodent reservoir on cruise ship linked abroad, not domestic outbreak

43.	Melioidosis	1990 - Group of imported monkeys Sporadic cases in man after arrival in GB from abroad
44.	Mpox (Monkeypox)	Increased human cases recorded since 2018 - all related to human transmission The UK continued to report cases throughout early 2026, Linked to travel or

		imported exposure: 28 Feb 2026: 34 clade Ib cases, 31 Mar 2026: 45 clade Ib cases
45.	Nairobi sheep disease	Never recorded
46.	Nipah virus infection	Never recorded
47.	Potomac Horse Fever ( <i>Neorickettsia risticii</i> )	Never recorded
